OPTION 4

This enables the project to go ahead supporting a development that is expected to benefit the whole district, not just the A&P Association. There are no direct financial impacts on the ratepayer, however funding this project would significantly increase Council's debt. This could potentially limit Council's ability to fund big projects in the future unless the debt is repaid or Council obtained an official credit rating at the cost of \$50,000 per year, which would facilitate further borrowing. In Option 4, the worst case scenario would be the failure of the project and Council having to lease or sell the land to service or repay the debt. If this option is selected by Council, then a change to the Treasury Management Policy will be required, naming this specific loan as an exemption from the Community Loans section of the policy.

1. **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

The purpose of the report is to present the submissions to the Policy and Services Committee in order for the Committee to make a decision on whether or not to proceed with lending \$7,180,000 to the A&P Association.

2. **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- 2.1 The A&P Association have requested Council support for a new venture in the purchase and development of land for a multi-use facility largely focusing on equestrian and motoring commercial, educational and sporting activities. There is also the potential for development of a regional outdoor events centre. It is expected that this development would be beneficial to the Stratford District and would contribute in some way to each of the four well-beings, social, economic, cultural and environmental.
- 2.2 On 8 September 2020, the Council made a decision to release to the public a proposal to lend \$7,180,000 to the A&P Association to purchase land for the purposes of the venture above.
- 2.3 Council received 559 submissions in relation to the proposal. The submissions ranged in location from Stratford residents to New Zealand wide.
- 2.4 The majority of the submitters were in support of the decision to lend the \$7,180,000 to the A&P Association to allow the project to proceed.
- 2.5 The minutes and subsequent resolutions of this hearing will be presented for adoption to Council at an Extraordinary Meeting to be held at 12.30pm on Tuesday 24 November 2020.

3. **LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 2002 – SECTION 10**

Under section 10 of the Local Government Act 2002, the Council’s purpose is to “enable democratic local decision making by and on behalf of communities; as well as promoting the social, economic, environmental, and cultural well-being of communities now and into the future”

4. **BACKGROUND**

- 4.2 The A&P Association is a charitable organisation with donee status, registered with the Charities Commission. The Association requires funding to support the purchase of land neighbouring the A&P showgrounds for a new local business venture which would derive rental income for the Association in the long term. Stratford District Council has been approached to assist with the purchase of the neighbouring land by financing the purchase.
- 4.2 The land proposed to be purchased is in two parcels totalling 63 hectares, (44ha and 19ha) at, and surrounding, the Stratford A&P showgrounds at the north east end of Stratford.
- 4.3 The business venture focuses around the development of the land to achieve enhanced economic and community outcomes for the Equestrian community, the Motorsport community, and for the Stratford District and Taranaki region. The Stratford A&P Association have advised that at capacity, the proposed venture could create up to 200 jobs in Stratford.
- 4.5 The Council is able to access significantly lower interest rates, than general commercial and community organisations, through the Local Government Funding Agency, which was set up specifically to provide lower funding costs to the local government sector.
- 4.6 There are significant financial and political risks involved in borrowing and on-lending \$7,180,000 to the A&P Association. The most significant financial risks being that the A&P Association is only just able to pay interest, and is unlikely to be able to make any loan repayments based on forecasts provided, and there is a risk that the project may fall over or not be able to generate sufficient net earnings before interest, and Council will have to call on the security to sell the land or assume ownership.
- 4.7 To mitigate this risk, Council will take security over the two properties to be purchased, and the property currently owned by the A&P Association (no registered mortgage on title).
- 4.8 The three properties have a combined land value of \$6,950,000, and an improvements value of \$1,000,000, as valued by Telfer Young (on behalf of the A&P Association) in 2020.

- 4.9 The A&P Association has approached various other funding organisations to fund the construction phase of the project. However, no funding has yet been confirmed and it is understood that the land for the project must be secured first before potential funders will be interested.

4.10 At the meeting held on Tuesday 6 October 2020, Council's Audit and Risk Committee endorsed the recommendation to lend the funds to the A&P Association subject to the following conditions:

- *A detailed business case was completed by the A&P Association and provided to Council with sufficient time to review. It should include a sensitivity analysis and demonstrate the A&P Association's ability to make principal repayments and cover development costs over a period of time.*
- *A second independent valuation addressed to Council.*
- *A detailed assessment of the impact on Council's borrowing capacity.*
- *An economic assessment of the viability of the business case and the economic impact of this project on the Stratford district.*

These are summarised in recommendation 2.

It is expected that this information will be provided in the agenda for the extraordinary Council meeting to be held on Tuesday 24 November 2020, prior to Council adopting the resolutions made by the Policy & Services Committee.

5. CONSULTATIVE PROCESS

5.1 Public Consultation - Section 82

The Public Consultation process involved the release of a two page consultation document in the Stratford Press on 7 October 2020. Information on the proposal was available on the Council website for a four week period. A public meeting was held on 22 October 2020, run jointly between the Council and the A&P Association - approximately 200 were in attendance.

The community were presented with five options, being:

- Option 1** Do nothing
- Option 2** Council supports the A&P Association with applications to philanthropic funders for the project.
- Option 3** Council becomes a guarantor for a loan sourced directly by the A&P Association.
- Option 4** Council borrows up to \$7,180,000 and on-lends the funds to the A&P Association.
- Option 5** Council buys the land and leases it to the A&P Association.

5.2 Maori Consultation - Section 81

On 8 September 2020, it was recommended that any decision, is consulted specifically with tangata whenua, particularly Ngāti Maru, who have mana whenua over this particular area. Ngāti Maru have been advised of the pending decision and offered the opportunity to provide input to the decision making process, however the iwi has not provided feedback.

6.1 Financial Risks include:

6.1.1 Debt Servicing

There is a risk that the A&P Association is unable to service the debt.

The forecasted financials provided by Baker Tilly for the generation of profits off the new land being purchased, in its current state under normal prudent conditions, indicate that the interest cost should be able to be covered.

The loan contract must ensure that there is sufficient provision to request full repayment, or the ability to call on its security over the land, if the A&P Association defaults on any interest payments.

6.1.2 Defaulting on Loan Repayments

There is a high risk that the A&P Association is unable to repay the loan when it falls due. It is highly unlikely that the A&P Association would have the ability to source funds to repay the debt in full, while also trying to source funds to develop the land for the specific recreational activities proposed. It is therefore anticipated that the loan would be rolled over for the foreseeable future with the A&P Association making the required loan interest payments.

To mitigate the impact of this risk, Council intends to hold security, over the property being purchased and the property the A&P Association currently owns. The Council has confirmed that there is no existing mortgage over the land the Association already owns.

The three properties have a combined land value of \$6,950,000, and an improvements value of \$1,000,000, as valued by Telfer Young (on behalf of the A&P Association) in 2020.

The Council must also consider the potential use of the land if it were to call on its security and take control of the land on which it has a registered mortgage over. The value of the improvements to Council will also need to be taken into consideration when drawing up a potential loan contract.

At the Ordinary meeting of Council on 8 September 2020 Council identified Option 4 as its preferred option pending the outcome of public feedback. This Committee can recommend any of the above options or identify an alternative as a result of feedback received and subsequent deliberations.

The proposal is for the loan to be cost-neutral to Stratford District ratepayers.

However, there is some risk that the A&P Association defaults on the terms of the loan (which are yet to be negotiated), which may result in some loss to Council. The risk will be mitigated through the loan contract and security over the three properties.

 - contractor's capacity to deliver; and
 - consequence of deferral?

It may limit Council's ability to invest in other community projects.

7.7 **Legal Issues**

- Is there a legal opinion needed?
- Are there legal issues?

A legal opinion was obtained from Simpson Grierson and presented to the Audit and Risk Committee in October 2020. There are no legal issues requiring further consideration.

7.8 **Policy Issues - Section 80**

- Are there any policy issues?
- Does your recommendation conflict with Council Policies?

The recommended option is not within the terms of the Treasury Management Policy.

This policy states that community loans are not to exceed a term of ten years.

The Policy also states that community loans are subject to the following:

- *“The production of a certificate from an independent Chartered Accountant which confirms the ability of the group or organisation to repay the loan sought (with supporting documentation as required by the Director – Corporate Services).*
- *The production of annual audited accounts, including a report from the Auditor as to his/her opinion of the solvency of the organisation.”*

Baker Tilly have provided financial forecasts showing the debt is able to be serviced at an interest rate of under 2%.

The second bullet point could be incorporated into the loan contract between Stratford District Council and the A&P Association.

Under Section 80 of the Local Government Act 2002, Council must identify any significant inconsistencies between a decision and a policy adopted by the Council outlining the reasons for the inconsistency and any intention to amend the Policy to accommodate the decision.

It is recommended that if the recommended option is selected by elected members, then the Treasury Management Policy should be amended to include this specific loan as an exemption from the Community Loans section of the policy.

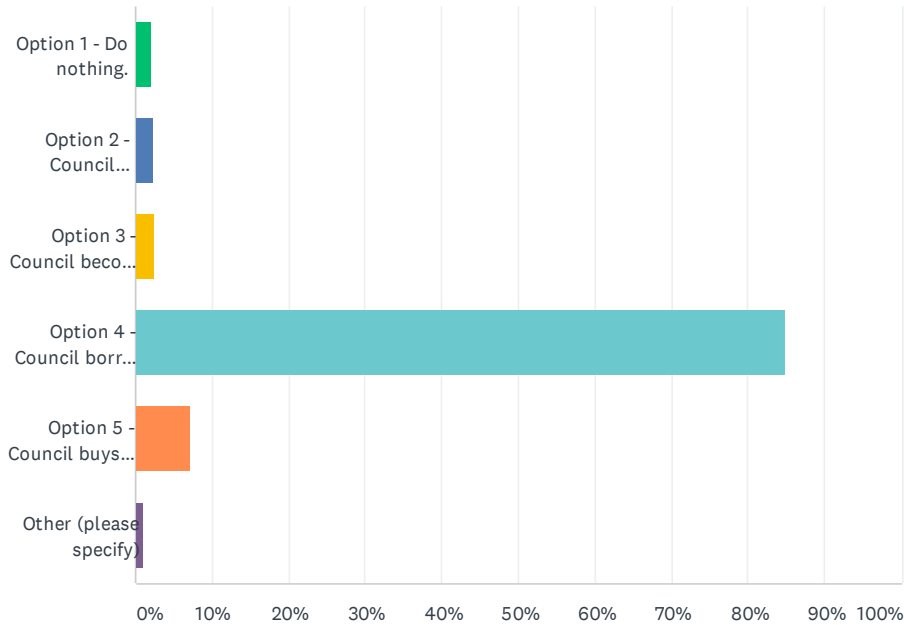

Whilst other councils examined the impact of COVID19 and opted for nil increases or very low increases, SDC continued with its belief that its residents could continue to afford an increase of 4.3 per cent. After job losses, and wage freezes, some of our residents are struggling to afford basic living costs...is the council aware? Do they care?

Given the current uncertainty for many people, I prefer option A - do nothing. This guarantees no risk to our community of any financial impact. This is a private proposal with some potential benefits to Stratford (benefits which haven't been defined). There is no 100% guarantee of any benefit, and no indication of whether this proposal could actually be detrimental to some Stratford residents (increased noise, traffic, impact on basic infrastructure etc)

Councils preferred option (4) indicates no risk - "There is no direct financial impact on ratepayers. While Council would take out the loan, the loan payments would be serviced by the A&P Association."

What happens if the loan is defaulted? I note the risk mitigation is "This potential cost could be offset by leasing or selling the land." but who covers the costs of the loan in the meantime - while these options are investigated by the council? Ratepayers! I would prefer the council take a very cautious approach in regards to this proposal and say No.

I have long held the view that our councils should concentrate their focus upon the delivery of essential services. That any commercial type activity should best be left to the commercial sector.
 However in the case of the A&P Associations proposal to purchase the Lilly Farm with the intent of creating the Stratford Park Proposal, I see a very important role for the council.
 It would appear that it is very unlikely that any one commercial investor would seize the opportunity to purchase the Lilly Farm for the purpose of establishing a Stratford Park Facility encompassing all the envisaged activities.
 Stratfords desperately needs an injection of commercial investment as our economic growth indicators seriously lag behind the National average.
 Capital investment of the type proposed for Stratford Park will over time attract local and outside capital investment into the community in the form of residential subdivision and housing, service industry and accommodation and no doubt lead to a more vibrant main Street.
 It would appear that the A & P Association lacks the resources to modernize its facilities on its own and so the downside of this project not proceeding would be that we would be left with a very mediocre showground facility for the future.
 However as has been demonstrated in other parts of NZ, where individual organisations have combined their resources, a successful multi use facility has emerged.
 Stratford District Council is in the unique position of being able to ensure that this project moves beyond the embryonic stage to become a reality with almost no financial risk to the ratepayers. We are told and have no reason to disbelieve the proposers that the cash flow from the property will enable the A & p association to meet all out goings. They are in the main farmers and have a very sound practical background of farming economics.
 The A & P Assoc assets are to be offered as security along with the Lilly Farm so the SDC position is very secure and in an all time low interest environment this is an opportunity that must be capitalised upon for the social and economic well being of the Stratford community.
 This is a massive opportunity for Stratford that, should it not succeed, we all as a community will be so much the poorer for it.

On behalf of Stratford Pony Club, we write to offer our strong support of the Stratford A&P Association in the councils decision on funding the Stratford Park Project - with our preferred option being Option 4.

Stratford Pony Club currently utilises the Stratford A&P Association grounds for club activities and events. We host a few events each season with our main event attracting over 100 horses and riders. The income from these events enables our club to hold regular rallies with instruction, purchase and maintain equipment, and for us to be able to send riders to compete in team competitions within the area and zone. In the past our members have also worked alongside Taranaki Area Pony Club in the running of zone and national competitions for mounted games on the grounds.

As a club we often struggle with being able to book the Stratford grounds for rallies and events due to the number and variety of users on the grounds. We have found over the last few years that the demand for the grounds has increased and that there is a lack of space for multiple users to share the grounds adequately. The variety of users and their individual needs puts limits on our ability to access facilities and what equipment is able to be used. Some users can also create health and safety risks for us to run at the same time, especially with the limited space available. Within the Taranaki area itself we have seen a reduction in the Pony Club eventing events due to losses of cross country courses that were held on private property, this has put restraints on the Taranaki area's ability to host national competition in this discipline.

Stratford provides a central location within Taranaki which makes it more accessible for equestrian users throughout the region. A centralised facility with sufficient space would help bring equestrian groups together developing a greater sense of community by utilising the shared infrastructure and facilities. Having a centralised equine park would provide our club with the facilities it needs to run club activities and events and the wider Taranaki area to host national competition. This type of facility and level of competition would not only benefit the equestrian community but the wider Stratford community with the people brought into the area.

Brisbane has four facilities available for practical driver training events and all four are busy year-round with driver training programs to suit all levels.

I believe that a facility such as The Stratford Park Project is proposing would be a great asset to the community by allowing for the operation of driver training programs ranging from Learner Drivers through to advanced driver courses for Commercial Drivers and Police/Fire/Ambulance Driver Training.

The benefits of young Taranaki drivers having a safe and controlled environment in which to learn safe driving techniques are enormous and will have a direct positive impact on road safety in Taranaki.

This potential, alongside the sporting and recreational capacity of such a facility, I believe make this proposal one of great value to the community and worth very serious consideration.

Hi, my name is Richard Gray. I'm from Manaia. Since moving into the area I have felt that the region needed a decent size Multi-Purpose Motorsport facility.

I support a proposal 4-5. i.e. somewhere between 4 and 5 where it becomes a joint venture between private and council where a separate Management Group is set up with appropriate representatives from both sectors.

Comments to consider:

a. Noise levels and controls - how will that impact with the Stratford community and is it likely to become a future issue? How will this issue be allowed for?

If an issue, should the whole complex be located further from town?

b. The Private land between the Racecourse and proposed land to purchase - can this be procured as it would seem to cause some compromises at present.

c. If managed well and made a commercial success, the current town area could be modernised and beautified to make Stratford a more attractive residential centre.

d. In doing this, any industry related to the interests the complex is being built around will get incentives to move their operations into the complex area.

I come from a Motoring and Motorsport interest so will centre around this sector.

1. Attractive modular flat-pack style commercial buildings for car franchises, autosport, auto-electrical-electronic, suspension and chassis, engineering and even design offices that can be erected as add-ons as demand demands.

These commercial facilities, if made attractive to businesses with use of the track for testing etc would be aimed at growing Taranaki as an automotive centre for NZ. Start smaller but with long term allowance for considerable growth.

2. For Clubs and Public; facilities for meetings - one large area that could be used for things like Weddings etc too, and smaller side rooms for committee meetings and smaller club gatherings. This should be done in association with 3 and 4 as follows.

3. Museum that would encourage people with interesting cars that overflow their garages to locate them in the Museum. Areas set aside for different types of cars from Vintage to Modern and Sporting to Classic everyday but often with a Motorsport leaning - in order to relate to the motorsport facility.

4. Library for Books and Magazines; Sections on Motoring and A&P interests. People to be encouraged to donate books that are surplus to needs and via their Will.

5. Start with the proposed shorter Club circuit but allow for up to an International circuit should the facility flourish.

6. Current spare land could be used for, as suggested, Eco Village/ accommodation combined with Park and Farming/ Agricultural land use to make it an

attractive 'zone' to live and stay.

7. The longer possible future circuits could be incorporated into the No. '6' land use area creating a Street/Rural type parklike circuit as sometimes seen in the UK and Europe. This larger circuit, if it came into being, would likely have set dates of the year for use.

8. Yes, agree with the types of suggested Motorsport facilities - Skid Pan, 1/8th and 1/4 mile Drag strips etc in association with the Track.

Good morning.

I am writing to express my support for the proposed Stratford Park Project under the councils preferred option of allowing the A&P Association to borrow the funding required at a reduced interest rate.

This park would be a huge asset for northern and central Taranaki as a whole, now and in the future. It has become increasingly difficult for the equestrian community to access safe areas and facilities for riding with roads now unsafe and farm owners becoming more and more reluctant to allow outside access to their properties. There is a facility in Hawera but at the very southern end of the district this is simply too far away and, to be honest, far too costly for the average person to use. Most local Pony Clubs are the hubs of the sport and as far as I'm aware most do not have the ability to expand beyond their existing council leases and, in the case of New Plymouth, may lose their ground altogether.

Equestrian sport is well supported in Taranaki with a number of groups running fantastic events for the people of the region and so much can be learned from owning a horse or pony. It's sad that over the last 20 years or so some aspects of the sport are being lost. Not so long ago every pony club in the district run a one day event but the upkeep of facilities and courses meant it was just too costly for these groups to maintain them. There are now 2 events run over 1 course at Waitara and 1 horse trial run at Hawera when there used to be at least 7 mostly run over private farmland. New Zealand has produced some of the best eventers in the world but without facilities and the space to have them it's a dying sport.

Including motorsport in the plan is a great idea and equestrian and motorsport could work together quite easily in my opinion. It brings in another form of income from a different demographic to help service the debt. A facility such as this would bring in a much larger contingent of outside competitors and opportunities for clinics and events to be held that wouldn't otherwise such as the largely supported kids camps run out of the equestrian centre in Taupo.

With the sports stadium already in Stratford and the pool upgrade in progress Stratford is fast becoming the sporting hub of Taranaki, the athletics track in Inglewood is not far away making Central Taranaki very much the place to be for sport.

I hope this proposal gets the support required to proceed as it would be very sad to see this opportunity lost.

Having been, and still involved in motorsport, the opportunity to have a dedicated multi-event venue in Taranaki and centrally located in Stratford would firstly benefit Stratford and ultimately the whole community.

If you look at what Highlands Park in Cromwell has done for Cromwell the potential to generate growth for Stratford is a given, primarily as the population of the region, and wider, is more accessible.

It's not that many years ago if you said to operate a forklift you would need a licence – we all would have laughed. And the time will come I'm sure that before someone can purchase a quad bike they will need to have passed a competency test. We all know now that farmers are required to wear helmets.

The proposed multi-event facility can cater to numerous motorsport events, equestrian, larger A&P events, machinery trade days (we all know how successful the Field Days are in Hamilton and Feilding) and farm machinery including quad bikes can be demonstrated to potential purchasers without the need for local suppliers incurring the costs of transport to farms - this would be very popular. As a ratepayer who lives on Flint Road West I wish to make the following comment on this proposal.

I have lived in this district all my life and have been a big supporter of projects of a positive nature.

In this case Council needs to have and know much more than we have read to date as Council should not be taking uncalculated risks on behalf of all our Ratepayers.

Where are the budgets that show this is a viable project?

Having served on the A&P association for a number of years (30+years ago and a member for 60 odd years)I am aware of how the association works and managed but the Board of Management is made up of members elected at their AGMs all with their own farms or businesses to run and manage along with financial commitments.

This is not a derogatory statement against their members but it does not carry the same commitment as our Councillors do.

So I am saying before any commitment is made by full Council I believe you need far more information and some proof this is a viable project. Council should not be taking calculated risks.

I also wish to add that should this project go ahead the whole Flint road West and East intersection could possibly require a round-a bout to cope with the increase in turning traffic as well noting it is a responsibility of NZTA. Also noting the Railway crossing getting in the way as well.

I also note the huge stock food business now occupying what was the Tannery with their exit and entree on to Flint road.

My wife and I bought land up Flint road 30 years ago then built a new home 25 years ago and since then till now there has been a huge increase in traffic volumes on SH3. On many occasions we can wait five to ten minutes to get out of our road.

Also noting that the speed limits at the intersection increase from 70 kms to 100 kms Also when there are major functions such as Speedway and A&P Shows it is almost impossible to turn right so invariable we turn left and turn at Monmouth road to return to town.

So I guess I'm saying that if this suggested project goes ahead exit and entry on to SH3 must be a major consideration.

We are also aware that the Stratford Racing Club were at some risks of being sold up by a resolution sitting with the Minister of Racing. I believe Council need far more information on what is happening on this front and being the neighbour to the proposed A&P purchase this land and buildings could require Council intervention.

Dear Councillors,

On behalf of Dorothy and myself we wish to make the following comment.

Our Stratford District Council and formally Stratford County Council and Stratford Borough Council up to the reforms of 1989 when our marriage took place has proven to be very successful.

We believe there are two threats on the horizon from Central Government that being more attempts at amalgamations such as Taranaki being one Council and the second being the amalgamation of our precious water supply systems even to the extent of being merged with those outside our Province.

Stratford has a great record of setting up a system of gravity feed from the Patea River at Cardiff since I believe around 1900.

Also have maintained this system to a very high standard and one our Ratepayers can be very proud of.

Our fear is if amalgamation is forced on us we will be the losers in that we will help to pay for the problems other Councils would bring with them such as the many millions of dollars New Plymouth needs to spend to upgrade their aging systems.

We ask our Council to vigorously oppose these moves if any attempts are made.

Thirty years ago Dorothy and I purchased our new property of 26 acres at the top end of Flint Road West as our retirement block. Then 25 years ago built a new home on it. In the last 25 years the increase of traffic on SH3 has been quite phenomenal particularly around large business growth in South Taranaki. When exiting our road to go to town sometimes we can wait as long as ten minutes to go especially around the late afternoons. We are also aware that if any proposal by Council and the Stratford A&P Ass goes ahead this will also make the intersection a lot worse.

In an attempt to give Flint Road West residents better options we encourage Council to consider purchasing the property on the north side of your new subdivision block off Pembroke Road extending the road and sections to Flint Road. In Gogging the World Map to this site it appears ideal however I am not aware if this land is for sale.

Also to support this move is the greater number of new subdivisions on our road in the last few years. Even today a further new entrance is being put in to a section right opposite us. We believe many on our road would support this move.

So we fully support Councils move to purchase land to provide new sections noting how successful this subdivision has been for Council.

Having managed the Aerodrome farm for Council during the 1980s and 90s I am a strong advocate for Council to retain this valuable asset but as well to maintain and protect the Aerodrome. Sometime during the 1980s the late Leo Carrington as Mayor showed me a

document that cemented retaining the whole area in perpetuity. This should be retained somewhere by Council. During my time managing the farm it was always, on behalf of Council we developed it into a model farm. So I am quite proud of Council's record with this. I was also keen for Council to metal a ten metre wide strip down the centre of the main runway for as Council is aware this whole farm was once a large swampy area but successfully drained but still gets wet in winter and spring. In speaking to topdressing pilots they agree the strip can get quite soft.

The cost to do this would not be great as there is a huge supply of pit metal on the banks of the Kahouri stream.

In discussion with the Aero Club it could be worth making a joint application for funding this project.

Finally, the subject of environmental issues facing our farming communities is in my opinion only going to get worse so we must rely on Council and especially our TRC to put forward a strong case in support for the huge efforts all our farmers in Taranaki have and are going to to mitigate what might be classed as pollution. Some comment we are bombarded with is absolute garbage. I know I don't need to remind Councillors that Taranaki farmers are leading the way in this field but could be treated no better than areas with environmental issues.

Also we hear little of the scientific trials at present being conducted within the industry to combat some of these so called issues such as new grass species and the advent of seaweed mixed with meal products etc.

I rest my case.

To whom it may concern

Firstly, let me begin with the fact that I am fully supportive of the Stratford A & P Association's proposal to develop the multi-use facility known as the 'Stratford Park Project'. I feel it would be an incredible asset and beneficial for the whole of Taranaki but specifically Stratford. As a ratepayer I have a vested interest in the success of this project. I also have a vested interest in the effect the funding of the project may have on the long term cost of rates for the Stratford ratepayers.

I feel the time frame for public consultation has been rushed and there has not been enough time for people to fully understand the proposal and all the aspects which will effect both stakeholders and ratepayers.

I have concerns relating to the risks which the Stratford District Council and ultimately the Stratford ratepayers may be exposed to by in effect underwriting the loan to purchase the land by the Council borrowing up to \$7,180,000 and then on-lending the funds to the A&P Association. Although it appears at face value that there would be no 'direct' risk financially to the ratepayers because the loan payments would be serviced by the A & P Association and, if in the sad event that they were unable to meet the repayments, then the land could be leased or sold to clear any outstanding debt. I think this is too simplistic a view. Other than the fact that the Council would be borrowing the \$7,180,000 and on-lending it to the Stratford A & P Association with, a small premium added for administration purposes, there are is no hard information regarding the servicing of the loan.

At the public meeting held Thursday 22 October 20 the concept of loss of Stratford District Councils reputation if the project failed was raised but clearly was not considered to be of any great importance. Surely if the Council loses its reputation and is seen as being fiscally irresponsible in the event of the project failing, then it would not be offered interest rates at the same advantageous rates for any subsequent borrowing. This extra cost would ultimately be borne by the ratepayer.

There was also the fact that by the Council borrowing the funds that this may impact Council's ability to borrow for big projects in the future as it would bring Council close to its current borrowing limit therefore limiting further borrowing. Admittedly the Council can mitigate this by obtaining an official credit rating. It appears this would cost up to \$50,000 per year. If my understanding is correct, a change to the Treasury Management Policy will be required to avoid the need for an official credit rating by naming this specific loan as an exemption from the Community Loans section of the policy.

Presumably the Council, meaning the ratepayers, would have to pay for this \$50,000 per annum should the official credit rating be required and also any increases in interest rates which may be incurred on future loan if the project should fail. This would inevitably end up in increased rates for the ratepayer.

Another issue, which I think was swept under the carpet at the public meeting, is the long term risk surrounding the inevitable lifting of interest rates on the loan and whether the A & P Association would be able to service the repayments using the current proposals if a lift of several significant percentage points occurred over the next few years. As the loan would be long term in nature the probability of interest rates lifting is quite high. It may not be within the next five years but it is not that long ago where interest rates were around the 8% mark. I fully understand that the information relating to the financial modelling which must have been produced in the feasibility studies and also the due diligence process is the property of Stratford A & P Association and therefore not necessarily available for public perusal. However, if the ratepayers of Stratford are being asked to support

their Council in this project, then surely the information surrounding the financial risks should be patently transparent and available so they can make an informed decision regarding their support for the Council providing the funding for the land purchase.

To reiterate my point of view, I am totally supportive of the proposal to develop the facility in principle, but feel there are undisclosed risks to the Stratford District ratepayers which may result in increased rating costs.

My name is Ian Benefield and I'm a Resident Farmer Ratepayer of the Stratford District Council. Also, I'm on the Executive Committee of the Stratford A&P Association. My interest there is to promote the interaction between urban and rural connectedness and understanding in a social and entertaining environment.

I supported the Strategic Review process as it identified a need for several interest groups' desire to centralise and share land and facilities for year round use. I believe with good planning, this land can provide a venue for additional Community recreational activities over many years to come.

It is unfortunate that this initial land purchase price is very high at this present time but with good Governance and buy-in, maybe considerable savings can be made during development stages. One thought perhaps a 3 week "Dig-a-thon" of Excavators, Trucks, Tractors and Trailers could do much of the initial site development as there are quite a few contractors and farmers associated with Motorsport and Speedway that may donate their time and machinery to the Project for a certain timeframe.

Hopefully in the not too distant future, the Racing Club will be more accommodating to other Equestrian groups to use their facilities that would enable some of the Lilley South Block to be sub-divided for residential and motel accommodation with Council then able to re-zone a Green Belt area around the Stratford Park Development, Racecourse and Golf Club.

Until this Park becomes self-funding, maybe low interest Government loans could be sourced for development, and Taranaki and Regional Trust funding could jointly contribute an annual amount to repay principal.

I feel very strongly that this large scale project is beyond the present A&P Association's ability to financially manage and govern. I personally think there should be a Charitable Trust entity formed that is governed by community leaders such as our Mayor, Council CEO, Funding Trust Chairpersons and CEOs who are able to debate/discuss issues, planning and funding in a very competent experienced Board-like manner.

I think the time has come to put idealist scenarios aside and make realistic, functional and achievable stages of development as major interest groups presently represented are all eager for amenity construction to proceed.

The Park needs to be cost-structured so that it is accessible and affordable to everyone from all walks of life to provide a venue for healthy, family-oriented outdoor pursuits.

Just as volunteers and financial contributions from various sources will have a big impact on the success of this venture, it would be greatly strengthened by both Stratford District Council and Taranaki Regional Council support in various ways such as this Loan arrangement but also ensuring it's success.

This is why I personally question the \$18,000 annual administration fee that will be charged to the Stratford A&P Association if this loan is approved. I would've thought a fee of \$500 to \$1,000 would cover any associated costs.

If a District is both lucky and fortunate, it may be presented with an opportunity for betterment approximately once in a twenty-year period. With respect to the Stratford Park Project, it has multiple components, which independently are rather insignificant to a district, but collaboratively form a major asset to the district.

Compare, for example, Stratford as a town with Cromwell in Central Otago. Cromwell benefitted greatly by the building of the Clyde Dam and the formation of Lake Dunstan and the infrastructure that was created in the town and surrounding district. Twenty years later I was involved in the development of Highlands Motorsport Park which has become the latest jewel in the crown of both the town and the district. Highlands had its detractors during construction and initial operation, but now eight years later is held up proudly as both a local employer and a destination for out of town visitors. Its Innovation and Technology Park along with its Commercial Subdivisions are currently being extended by another Stage due to purchaser demand.

Stratford Park Project, I see as a short to medium term project which can best be described as a new Suburb of Stratford which will enhance the district. Its land initially lends itself to continue as the status quo with all its current utilisation including farming to ensure its financial viability. Land does not over time devalue, which retains or increases in value to mitigate financial risk.

Careful consideration during the Plan Change and Consent Process would be required to best utilise this “New Suburb”. Think well into the future when proceeding along this path.

The financial reality associated with this development would, in my view, require an initial income stream from the development of a Commercial and Light Industrial Subdivision along both the Flint Road frontages and onsite parallel with the railway. This initial subdivision would generate a rating income for the district, whilst also establishing roading access to the Stratford Park Project and supplying part funding for other items within the complex. As these sections sell and are developed, this Suburb begins to take shape and grow.

Individual business cases can then be applied to the multiple other activities the site can provide for. During this process, the purchased land is still generating farming income to service any financial requirements.

As these Individual business cases, Speedway, Equestrian Activities, Vehicle Driver Upskilling, Off Road Farm Machinery Operational Training, Alternative Energy Vehicle Testing, Motorsport Activities, and an enhanced Agricultural and Pastoral Association Facility procure their funding to proceed their individual venture, the Stratford District continues on with mitigated financial risk.

This is a very brief overview of how other similar projects I have overseen have evolved. I am happy to meet with both council and other interested parties in the future to continue this conversation. As my current work commitments have me again in Central Otago during the public submission timetable, I will be unable to present this Submission in person. Feel free to contact me in the future.

Dear Stratford Council,

I am writing this submission against option 4 and in favour of option 2 as the preferred method of funding the Stratford Park Project proposed by the Stratford Agricultural and Pastoral Association (APA).

I base this on the following:-

- 1) If Stratford Council borrows 7.2 million dollars, it alone will be responsible for the loan repayments. Despite any legally binding contract between the council and APA the loan repayments will ultimately fall on the council. There is a risk that the APA could default on payment and the council will then have to take legal proceedings against APA at a high cost in legal fees to Stratford ratepayers.
- 2) Borrowing this amount will bring the council close to its borrowing limits, this could put at risk future borrowing. This action could remove financial provision for future unexpected events, earthquake or volcanic activity etc.
- 3) The council claim that if the venture is unsuccessful and the APA is unable to meet repayments the land can be sold or leased. How easy would it be to sell land on which construction has already begun and which may involve third parties which are owed money by APA? These parties may have deeper pockets to fund litigation against a sale than Stratford Council has to defend it.
- 4) Could Stratford Council repay, on an informal basis, the APA for the difference between the interest rate that they can obtain and the commercial rate that the APA will have to pay. This cost can then be recovered when, or if, the venture turns a profit. This will incur ongoing risk but could be terminated at any time should things go wrong.

In conclusion this project appears to be too ambitious. It involves too many partners which inevitably results in misinterpretation of the aims of the overall project and then acrimony. Stakeholders then move away to newer facilities elsewhere, and the projects become "white elephants" requiring public funding to prop them up. New Zealand has a history of projects that promised to be "game-changers" and have failed in this way.

Could the council borrow say 3 million dollars to refurbish the Broadway with new paving, plants/trees, a light activated pedestrian crossing, traffic islands etc. I would welcome the council on-lending small amounts to shop owners to clean, repaint and repair their property fronts and tidy up un-leased and empty buildings with some sort of attractive temporary hording. This would smarten up our main street.

Putting Stratford "on the map" could be achieved for less than \$100,000.00. Install two high resolution cameras, one directed at the Glockenspiel (with sound) and the other toward Mount Taranaki (with Iwi approval), then live-stream them both on You-Tube 24/7. Ensure they are clearly identified as "Stratford, Taranaki New Zealand" and you have a potential world-wide audience of billions. You-Tube has many towns that have raised their profile in this way, tourists are curious to see more and put these towns on their list for their next visit.

I hope the council can support the APA in renewing its building stock, expanding the site by a small amount and upgrading the motor sport venue to include the driver training course. But I am afraid the days of big projects are over, they are no longer viable in our current unpredictable economic climate.

Submission and request to make a verbal submission, from Dana Haszard.

I thank the Stratford District Council for their consideration of options to progress the Stratford Park Project. I support Council's preferred option: Option 4.

I have been involved across a range of equestrian activities in Taranaki since the 1970s and observed for some time a consistent pattern of equestrian venues becoming unavailable or significantly reduced in size.

This insecurity of tenure has unfortunate effects: Club activities are consequently curtailed. Membership can reduce and the valuable volunteer 'capital' is expended adapting to smaller areas or finding and setting up at a new venue.

Eventing, a discipline within equestrian sport for which NZ is respected and admired internationally, was able to depend on private land owners allowing courses to be built on their land and used for a number of years on their properties. Taranaki had up to six such courses available each season. These courses have been located across the province: Carlyle, Hawera, Opunake, Okato, Stratford, Waitara, Inglewood, Lepperton and Tikorangi. For reasons which include changes in farming practices such farmland opportunities rarely exist.

The opportunity for the equestrian community to have a base of the size, location and potential that Stratford Park can offer is unprecedented. The timing is significant: Most equestrian groups experience issues of uncertainty of land tenure for their activities and restricted opportunities to host events. People (read potential volunteers) seem to be increasingly busy and spare time appears to have become increasingly scarce. There is the potential to pool resources such as equipment and person power. The Stratford Park Vision provides an opportunity to develop a new and exciting cohesiveness for the equestrian community.

The vision for the equestrian component of Stratford Park has developed within a framework that recognises the diversity of the equestrian community and the opportunities that are inherent in equestrian involvement. The range includes activities at the grass roots level as well as providing for some inspirational top level performances within equestrian disciplines. Exposure to such a range is likely to interest, motivate and inspire people of all ages. Stratford District Ratepayers are being asked by Council to support a proposal by the A&P Association to finance the land purchase, via a loan, for their "Stratford Park Project".

This document is my submission on that proposal.

Two Aspects

The Mayor stated at the presentation that there are two aspects to this project as far as the Stratford Community are concerned.

- 1) The Proposal by Council to raise a loan of \$7.18 million in funding through its preferential lending sources, then on-lend that to the A&P Association in order for it to purchase the land.
- 2) The development of the current A&P Showgrounds to a larger facility including the establishment of an Equestrian facility and the expansion of the current Motorsport facility to include a dedicated Motor racing circuit and a Drag Strip.

Whilst the deliberation of Elected Members of Council will primarily focus on the funding aspect it is, in my view, both aspects that are of importance to the wider Community.

Presentation on 22 October 2020

The Presentation on 22 October was well delivered and informative particularly considering the primary speaker, Neil MacDonald, is a volunteer for the A&P Association and it is not his primary employment.

From my position in the audience the show of hands indicated the majority were local ratepayers. This number was closely followed by the Motorsport fraternity. Significantly behind these two groups in numbers were the A&P Association Members and lastly the Equestrian fraternity. The numbers of these four groups is telling in their respective interest in the Project.

It was stated that there is an urgency to approve raising the funds for this Project due to a condition in the offer from the current landowner creating a deadline in December.

Stratford future development

I strongly believe that Stratford needs to increase its population and diversify its economy. This Project was portrayed at the Presentation as providing the potential for that.

The population of Stratford in 1906 was 6,000 for 2013 it was 9,000, a 50% increase. Census data for the same years show New Plymouth's population was 7,000 and 74,000, over ten fold or 1,000% increase. Clearly Stratford is not developing and in fact has been reducing in size since 1961. Something needs to be done to halt the decline.

Stratford is, and most likely always will be, a town supporting the local rural sector. That role should not constrain any diversification to other sectors.

Why was this when this Project includes facilities that they do not currently have. Could it be that they are not really on board with the proposal?

Motorsport

Phil Macey and another spoke very passionately about the project and what it would provide for Motorsport in Taranaki and the wider area. Both speakers stated they are not residents of Stratford.

Both speakers mentioned that this Project had been discussed amongst the various motorsport clubs in Taranaki for some time. Yet it has only recently been made known to the Stratford Community as a whole.

The Proposed Master Plan shows Item 7 as a Drag Strip and Sealed Aerodrome. During the presentation there was no mention of discussions having taken place with the Stratford Aero Club regarding a sealed runway or the Stratford District Council on the future of Stratford Aerodrome land. In my view the construction and use of a Drag Strip is totally incompatible with the operational needs of an aircraft runway. To imply that a Drag Strip could be used as an operational runway is totally misleading.

There is no doubt that the Taranaki Motorsport fraternity are fully behind this Project as it will provide them with a Motorsport hub.

Neil MacDonald alluded to some form of Driver Training Circuit for Heavy Vehicles, although this is not shown on the Proposed Master Plan. No one from the transport sector spoke about there being a need for such a facility in Taranaki.

Stratford Racing Club

The land occupied by the Stratford Racing Club features prominently on the Proposed Master Plan indicating it is an important stakeholder. However Neil MacDonald mentioned the Stratford Racing Club only briefly during his introduction saying that they had been approached but at this time were not a Party to the Project.

4 Wellbeings

The Mayor stated that Council is required to consider 4 Well-beings during its activities. I do not know what criteria Council uses to decide whether an activity ticks those boxes so the following is my subjective view of how the Project stacks up against those Wellbeings.

Social

The A&P and Equestrian portions would tick the box as a social wellbeing activity for the Stratford Community. Motorsport, in its current form, could not be considered a Social wellbeing activity for the Stratford Community as a whole.

Economic

The Project was presented as having the potential to bring great economic benefits to Stratford District. However no actual evidence to support such optimism was presented.

Environmental

The A&P and Equestrian portions of the Project probably have little impact on the Environment so would tick the box.

Motorsport, in its current form, is not an environmentally friendly activity. The by-products of Motorsport are excessive noise and pollution. Both of which have adverse health effects on the local community and wider environment. The harmful effects to the natural environment, of the whole World, caused by pollution from burning fossil fuels are well known. Therefore Motorsport would not tick the Environmental wellbeing activity box.

Cultural

Agricultural and Pastoral activities would be considered an integral part of Stratford District. Therefore the A and P aspect would tick the box. Whether Equestrian would is doubtful. Stratford District does not have an Equestrian culture such as say Waipa District does.

Neither Stratford District, nor Taranaki as a whole, is not known to be Culturally associated with any form of Motorsport. It would therefore not tick the box.

Alternative Option for the Land

Council’s Pembroke Road subdivision has proven to be successful and has shown there is a need for more quality housing in Stratford. An established property developer could be encouraged to build residential properties on the southern block. Council could lend the \$3.88 million at Council’s preferential interest rates to the developer for the purchase the land. This land would likely support 200-300 residential properties.

- It will tick all four well-being requirements.
- Provide much needed housing stock.
- Enlarge the Stratford population by 400-700.
- Enlarge the income base of Stratford District Council.
- Increase in retail spending in Stratford.
- The repayment of the loan would be a much shorter timescale than with the A&P Association who envisage 40-45 years.

The price of housing in New Plymouth is significantly higher than Stratford yet is only a 45 minute drive. Like Inglewood, Stratford could become a dormitory town for New Plymouth, but with much better retail and other community facilities.

I believe that in increase in Stratford’s population of this size would have a much larger beneficial effect for the District than this Project.

Possible adverse events and risks.

The impact of the Government's reaction to Covid-19 are becoming more apparent over time. What impacts this might have over the next few years is uncertain.

With the changing world wide view on the Environment there are indications that the way in which we produce food may need to change. How might associated Government Legislation impact on the local rural economy?

China's most recent five year plan set out to reduce their reliance on external food sources. China is New Zealand's largest single market for dairy and meat so how might this impact on the local rural economy?

The recent announcement by the TSB Community Trust not to accept applications from Councils this financial year will impact Stratford District, as has been stated with regard to the Pool replacement. What the situation might be next financial year is uncertain.

Three Waters Reform. What impact will this have on the long term viability of Stratford District Council to exist and in turn on the repayment of the loan particularly for Stratford District Ratepayers?

Scenario. After the implementation of the Three Waters Reform the viable reason for the existence of Stratford District Council may not exist. Central Government may decree that Stratford District Council be absorbed in an adjacent Council, e.g. STDC. If this were to occur would the ultimate responsibility for the loan become that of all STDC Ratepayers, or would the loan be called in and the then Stratford District Ratepayers have to repay the loan?

The Mayor stated that the borrowing by Council for the \$7.18 million may, or may not depending on how it is accounted for, impact on Council's ability to borrow for future projects. Council may be required to pay an annual fee of \$50,000 to obtain future borrowing. The A&P Association should pay this fee.

What is very clear is that responsibility for repayment of the loan will rest with Council, which ultimately means that it will be for the District's Ratepayers to make repayments. The bottom line risk is that Stratford District Ratepayers will have to fully repay the \$7.18 million being requested. In my view this risk is being seriously downplayed by Council.

Taranaki Ratepayers are being asked to pay more and more for additional sporting and recreational facilities whilst at the same time the Region's economy is declining. Notably; the re-build of New Plymouth's Yarrows Stadium before we have even finished repaying for the last rebuild. Moves are afoot for a multi-sport stadium in New Plymouth. Once the costs of that are in it will likely be called the Taranaki Multi-Sport stadium and all Taranaki ratepayers will be billed not just those in New Plymouth.

The forecast of the impact of climate change will likely have for the west of New Zealand is to be wetter and windier with slightly higher temperatures. How might this impact the operation and financial viability of the three participant groups over the 40-45 year period and their ability to repay the loan?

With such a long loan period other less possible events should also be considered. An eruption of Mount Taranaki would deposit a considerable amount of ash over the area. I am sure that Council have information on the economic impact this would have on the District.

One of those impacts one might well be the A&P Association going into liquidation. If this were to occur then Stratford Ratepayers would have to fund the loan repayments. This might well be on land and infrastructure that has little or no actual value at that time, just cost.

Conclusion

I do **not** support Council's Proposal to adopt Option 4 to borrow \$7,180,000 and on-loan that to the A&P Association.

In addition I do **not** support this Project in its current form for the reasons set out below.

There is no publicly available evidence to demonstrate that the A&P Association has the ability to repay the \$7.18 million required to purchase the land.

The A&P Association considered \$10 million to replace the current facilities as too much and difficult to repay. Therefore how would they obtain funding and repay a similar or larger amount for the infrastructure the Project requires?

It does not appear that the Equestrian fraternity are actually on board with this Project.

The Stratford Racing Club are definitely not on board with this Project.

The expansion of the current Speedway circuit plus the inclusion of a dedicated Motor racing circuit and a Drag Strip is incompatible with the Environmental well-being of the Stratford community.

I also believe that Motorsport, in its current form, is incompatible with the Social well-being for the Stratford community. It may be considered a social activity for those attending an event but for the majority of Stratford residents who do not attend it is not a socially acceptable activity with its noise and pollution.

In my view there is no genuine urgency for the project to purchase the land. The land will still be there in years to come.

I would strongly urge Councillors not to pass any motion regarding raising the \$7.18 million required and then on lending it to the A&P Association to purchase the land.

Final Comment

This Project has been discussed by the A&P Association with some Council staff and some Elected Members on a continuing process for over 3 years, as stated by The Mayor.

Why was this not previously signalled to residents and particularly all Elected Members before now?

This is disappointing and highly disturbing as it demonstrates a lack of transparency by some in Council.

There now also appears to be a sense of urgency?

The genuineness of that sense of urgency should be thoroughly questioned by Councillors.

Rationale

The project has been cited as “Ground Breaking” we strongly disagree, as we have seen no firm evidence of facilities elsewhere in NZ that have sound operation models similar to the project plan for Stratford’s Equestrian Park. This model has not been proven to work even in Equestrian dense regions like Auckland, Waikato and Christchurch let alone in a region with a small equestrian population like Taranaki.

It was stated at the 22nd October public meeting that the site neighbours a meat works and industrial businesses, which were a perfect fit for the park. Again we disagree, having run or been involved in 12 equestrian events at Manfeild Park, by far the vast majority of complaints from competitors were centred around noise pollution from both motor racing on the adjacent Manfeild track and the abattoir over the road from the truck park. Both could be considered a Health & Safety issue for equestrian sport.

Furthermore the Egmont Showgrounds was labelled “Limited” at the meeting, but for far less than the cost of the land purchase for the Stratford A&P Association project the Egmont Showgrounds could be developed to be the best equestrian venue in NZ. Expansion of the indoor arena and construction of additional all weather surfaces is all that is required. It already has the majority of the infrastructure, services, buildings and adequate land (32ha) with access to an adjacent property allowing one of the few cross country courses left in Taranaki to be maintained. Most of the buildings are in good repair due to planned maintenance in the last 10 years and no other venue in NZ can house as many horses under cover, which is now the preferred option for horse accommodation for most equestrian competitors.

The questions we would like you to consider are as follows.

Why is Stratford District Council proposing to enable the Stratford A&P Association to purchase land on which to build an equestrian facility that is in direct competition with its neighbours at the Egmont Showgrounds in Hawera and which contravenes the Regional Sports Strategy agreed to by Stratford District Council.

Following a show of hands at the 22nd October public meeting, there appeared to be a very small representation of equestrian people present, about 10% of the total, or about 20 people, seven of them including myself were from the two A&P Associations. This should be ringing alarm bells for you as councillors, if there was a real need for a venue of this type in Stratford would it not be expected that a large contingent of equestrian people would be present? Where were the people from the four ESNZ disciplines that have groups in Taranaki, Area Pony Clubs, the two Adult Riding Clubs, two Miniature Horse Associations, Arabian & Welsh Pony Breed Societies, Taranaki Western Riding Club, trainers & coaches looking for venues, local veterinarians and equine practitioners, tack shop owners, recreational riders, Taranaki Equestrian Network, Riding School owners, farriers and other equestrian suppliers?

Why is Stratford Racing Club not involved in the development? If it is to be a true equestrian park supporting equestrian based businesses, user groups and events you must question why the Racing Club has not pledged inclusion in the project given their proximity to the site

Conversely to the above, we would support the proposal to facilitate land purchase if it was only to develop a motorsport park, this is a progressive, commendable and exciting project that would provide a new sporting facility for Taranaki. We also acknowledge the considerable effort and work that has gone into the feasibility study by Neil MacDonald and the projects Steering Committee.

I am responding to the request for community feed back on the Stratford Park Project (the project).

There appears to be two very separate issues being considered , namely

- 1 whether the Stratford District Council (SDC) should consider supporting the project
- 2 whether the SDC should invest in the project as outlined under option 4 of the SDC discussion document.

Clearly any business opportunity , such as that outlined by the A & P Association, that could benefit the community is worthy of SDC consideration and I applaud the efforts of the A & P Association to date.

However as to whether the project should be supported in some form by the SDC will presumably depend on an evaluation by the SDC of net tangible and intangible benefits that will be passed onto to the community as a result of the project.

If I am correct this initial stage (stage 1) of the overall project only involves the acquisition of land , not the development of the business structures (stage 2) as such. Based on information presented to ratepayers to date, there will be a significant investment required beyond the initial capital required to purchase farm land as described. Even if stage 1 proceeds then one presumes that there remains significant planning to get stage 2 off the ground.

Whether there would be a benefit to the community from completion of Stage 1 has been referred to in the information made public . However I found the analysis to be short on substance and there did not appear to be any of the necessary risk analysis. In discussing the Risk Mitigation / Cost and Impact on Ratepayers, contrary to the narrative attaching to Option 4 ,obviously would there be a cost to ratepayers if lease income and or revenue generated from land ownership was exceeded by SDC debt servicing costs. There in lies a significant risk if modelling has been based on current interest rates. Until such time as the investment is repaid ,is there any certainty interest rates incurred by SDC will not increase significantly from the current historically low levels? Is there any guarantee that land prices will remain at current levels to avoid a possible capital loss in the event that asset sales were necessary?

I presume councillors will not expose ratepayers to such unquantifiable risks.

Protecting the SDC borrowing opportunities by seeking a credit rating may be a solution today , but will such an option exist in the future, and if so at what cost ?

Stating that the debt will be serviced by the A & P Association and will therefore not impact ratepayers assumes that the Association and its members can guarantee interest and principal repayments which is an unrealistic expectation and hence creates a risk to which I presume councillors will be unwilling to expose ratepayers.

In short it appears that there is a fair degree of uncertainty in relation to the venture and how and to what degree different outcomes could impact ratepayers.

Therefore implying that there has been limited opportunity for the SDC to gain an assurance that there will be tangible or intangible benefits to the community.

in such circumstances I presume that whilst the SDC can be supportive of the project , the promoters of the project will have to demonstrate with the appropriate documentation and with the relevant financial modelling , that there will be guaranteed benefits to the community before the SDC can commit to support the project in any form.

As to whether the SDC should invest in the project (be an investment facilitated by way of the SDC borrowing per option 4) would presume that all necessary sign off as above has been achieved by the SDC , and that all avenues to support the promoter have been explored.

As I can not conclude that the SDC has satisfied itself that the community should support the project , and further that alternative opportunities to support the promoter have been considered, I would not support an investment as proposed ..option 4.

As backgroud to this view I question whether councillors should be asked to evaluate the commercial complexities of such a loan / investment arrangement . If the promoters cannot fund the initial capital requirements from conventional commercial sources there is clearly a heightened risk of interest and principal default which should be a significant concern to councillors. Given the ramifications of such decisions I would presume that independent expert advice would be ultimately relied upon.

In addition does an investment as proposed meet legislative requirements regulating the decision making of councillors.

Stratford Showgrounds Proposal Feedback

From: Jim Clarkson (Resident and Ratepayer)

(1) Council Proposal (Option 4) to Support A&P Association to Purchase Land by taking a loan up to \$7,180,000

Oppose:

- This is far too high of a financial risk for the Stratford District Council (SDC) and ratepayers of Stratford.
- It is not a risk that ratepayers should be taking and may impact a future ability to secure loans for essential services for the town and district i.e. water supply, roads, public facilities, local parks and reserves as well as further development and maintenance of essential services.

Explanation: We presently have the need to provide an all season water supply, good roading standards and maintenance in rural areas and good rural community facilities. There are existing projects planned that may need further funding to complete. Weed infestations, pest/predator species control and litter/rubbish clean-up are existing issues in need of attention in our parks and reserves areas. The council has been able to embark on substantial upgrades and improvements in recent years. Ongoing funding will be required to maintain these facilities to a high standard. Continued development of essential services and work to protect our natural areas is required to improve and maintain our social wellbeing into the future. This all needs to be done without relying on rate increases.

(2) Council Support for A&P Proposal In It's Current Form

Oppose

- The proposed land purchase of the area south of Flint Road has high potential for further residential development. It is poor judgement to bring this sort of development into and close to the residential area. Present residents adjacent to this area will be subject to increased noise levels and activity. By statute and under district plan rules local authorities are required to set in place rules so that noisy land use activities do not clash with nearby residential areas.
- The proposed "Motorsport Hub" is the wrong sort of development and does not belong in the realm of the A&P association. This aspect of the proposal will have negative impacts on the social and environmental wellbeing of the local area.

Explanation:

- a. The Stratford A&P Website presently states; "The Stratford Agricultural & Pastoral Association Inc. is a charitable not for profit organisation. Membership is open to anyone interested in agricultural and pastoral in Taranaki and supporting the Stratford Show Event held on the last weekend of November each year". (Stratford A&P Website 2020). This does not fit such a proposal.

- b. The Stratford District Council presently does not monitor noise levels associated with the present Stock Car Racing which takes place at this site. The current noise levels can have considerable impact depending on wind direction, at any time, when these events are held. It is not known whether there is an existing noise control plan for this site to protect participants, spectators or the residents of the Stratford District. There is also an unmeasured amount of dissatisfaction about present noise levels from residents of Stratford. Moving this activity further to the north and expanding the type and number of events into the proposed land purchase area will not minimise the present negative impacts and will have a major impact on those closer to that site. This will impact also on council who will need to begin monitoring and implementing controls to minimise adverse effects.

- c. This year we have witnessed a cry out from youth and others to reverse the effects of climate change. Climate change and global warming are a reality, it is becoming more necessary for all of us to increase our environmental awareness and have some conscience for our actions. Increasingly our council will need to reflect this growing awareness as well. Council will need to consider these things in the face of what they are presenting as a "game-changer". Economic growth and facility development does not necessarily materialise as environmental and social wellbeing. Motorsport racing is way outside the more passive and entertaining activities of the Agricultural and Pastoral Society, and carries immense detrimental impacts to environmental wellbeing.

Summary: I would support a much changed proposal that grew the true values of the Agricultural and Pastoral Society. I don't believe it should include an encroachment on Stratford's future residential growth, should not include land purchase at a risk to ratepayers and should focus on growth and synergy with the Stratford Racing Club if this is possible. As well, the focus needs to include putting control measures in place so that activities do not negatively impact on social, cultural and environmental values for those people that live in the residential areas of Stratford. I am concerned that council is seeking opinion of feedback on a more regional basis. The ratepayers of the Stratford District are the ones that will have to suffer a debt risk and the negative impacts of such a development. The Stratford ratepayers should be in control of this decision making process.

Stratford A&P Association Proposal

Thank you for the opportunity to submit on Stratford District Council's (SDC) proposal to assist Stratford A&P Association with its development plans.

South Taranaki District Council (STDC) supports the proposal for the development of a motor sport hub in central Taranaki and we see benefits for Stratford and for Taranaki as a region, with this specific part of the initiative.

However, STDC **does not support**, in any form, a regional equine hub in central Taranaki.

The *Taranaki Regional Sport Facility Strategy (Regional Strategy)* identifies South Taranaki (specifically Egmont A&P Showground, Hāwera) as the equestrian hub for the region and any funding (including providing a loan to purchase land) toward regional facilities for equestrian should be focused on improving that facility rather than creating new ones. We note that the *Regional Strategy* does provide for a local equestrian facility in North Taranaki. We would argue that if Stratford decided to build an equestrian facility it should be at the 'local' level only and should not compete with South Taranaki as the identified Taranaki regional equestrian hub.

The *Regional Strategy* takes a targeted, regional approach to facility development, to maximise the profile and utilisation of facilities across the region – the SDC proposal would suggest that a competitive approach is being taken within the equestrian community. STDC considers this a significant backward step for the region, where the three districts have traditionally worked together to maximise community benefits.



The *Regional Strategy* is recognised by the region's partners and major funders and is a cornerstone of all regional sporting facility development in Taranaki. STDC suggest that if SDC support the development of an equine hub in Stratford, this would undermine the collaborative approach taken in the development of the *Regional Strategy*.

We would like to be heard in support of this submission.

I am opposed to the Stratford District Council assisting financially in anyway with the proposed purchase of the adjoining properties to the A & P Association boundaries known as the 'Lilley' properties as outlined in the current proposal.

I find it surprising the council would sway to pressure to be part of a large concrete, tarmac, metal surface in exchange for productive rural pasture and the demolition of residential zoned land. Our environmental science is telling us more green, less noise, less pollution and less use of carbon fuel is better for our community and our children's overall health. Having driven around NZ I have noticed other racing arenas are in the main idyll. They lie close to communities with larger populations. Perhaps the car racing people could travel to the already existing tracks.

I listened at the public meeting to Don O'Connor's account of self and obvious interest in Motorsport. Like a lot of the racing fraternity they arrive, make noise and leave. Food takeaways, garages and the odd motel may benefit but mostly these people are self-reliant. The community once again tolerating another noisy Saturday evening. The council could take a serious look at the impact this grey noise's impact has on our environment. As a suggestion, the Flint Road residential zone could be planted out to help provide a noise barrier for the already existing noise impact on our town and surrounding area.

I would like to see an overhaul of the present property and buildings within the means of the Agricultural and Pastoral Association Inc. As their title suggests this would be more in keeping with our rural connections. The existing stakeholders, the Taranaki Motorsport Trust and the Equestrians could appear to be elitists with little contribution to our community in general. Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the proposed Stratford Park Project.

I am not going to dwell on the simple and commonly known facts, such as the assets and facilities at the current A&P facility being in poor substandard condition, and in cases are a health and safety issue, or the fact that the world has changed since the facilities inception many decades ago, and households don't want these facilities as neighbours, as these are already well publicised facts that the key SDC personal appear to be well aware of.

What I do wish to reiterate, is that the organisations utilising the A&P facilities are a huge asset to our community and they need a viable venue at which to retain functionality for our future generations.

The events hosted by the Stratford A&P society are something really special for our community, and have a history that is unsurpassed by other regions, I am a regular visitor to their venue to oversee track watering for the Taranaki Stockcar club, and it is not often that I visit anytime during any week, where there is not someone using the facility for horse training or suchlike.

My family have been involved with, and have been active members of the Taranaki Stockcar Club Inc for three decades to date, and I have had a great deal of experience with this club and its members. This club has provided many years of entertainment for the wider community, and visitors to our region, all of whom bring a large spend to the businesses of our community.

We regularly attended at least 25 events per year at the grounds. As a family we find this very much our major entertainment venue for the summer and as we live in New Plymouth, we have no issue with travelling to Stratford to attend the events.

Since we have been bringing my 2 sons to the speedway events over the last decade, they have chosen speedway as one of their preferred sports and we now have become members of the TSCC.

My eldest son is now 15 years old and has raced his Ministock car for 3 years and now my second son who is 13 years old has just starting racing his Ministock car this year also in the Youth class. The responsibilities, life and work skills my boys are learning along with the friendships they are making with their fellow competitors while they are involved in this form of motor racing is just incredible. Having this type of great family sporting environment means they are learning skills they would not have been gaining any other way. The TSCC environment is a great opportunity to follow their passion of motorsport in a positive environment free of drugs and violence. As speedway is very much a family sport for our family, it is very common to have a large number of our extended family attending speedway to support my son's along with the other competitors we have got to know through the different walks of life we have been involved with, some days at the speedway we bump into someone we have meet through a school event, not knowing they are also great fans of speedway. This shows that speedway is a great family sport to be involved with!

As part of my role as Operations Manager at Uhlenberg Haulage, I oversee the driver training of all our staff. Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback to the proposal to support the Stratford A&P Association (A&P) with its' "Stratford Park Project".

I do not wish to speak to my submission.

Submission

I am not in favour of the Stratford District Council (SDC) on lending \$7.18m to the A&P as per Option 4. Not because, although minimal risk to the SDC and ratepayers, there is quite a potential risk to the A&P. They will have all the financial "skin in the game" at this stage.

I would prefer Option 3 that Council becomes guarantor for a loan directly by the A&P. This would demonstrate that Council is committed to the development of the Stratford Park Project.

Is there any reason why Council can't continue with the loan application as per Option 4, but instead of the A&P land being the security, the Council acts as guarantor, that way Council has some "skin in the Game" rather than a small organisation having to carry all the risk? It also then allows the A&P to have financial means to carry out necessary improvements or replacements to their ageing infrastructure as per A&P Option 3, which is to marginally increase land area and undertake redevelopment projects. By going with Option 3

After hearing all that was said at the public meeting, which was all very positive, I would say by the show of hands that the majority of attendees were beneficiaries of the proposed project. However, it would seem that the only ones putting their hands in their pockets financially are the A&P who will be putting up their property as security. I can understand why the motorsport and equestrian fraternity would be so supportive as they may get a start to a great complex for themselves without having any initial financial risk.

Lack of Information

I am extremely disappointed at the lack of financial information that has been made available for ratepayers to be able to make an informed decision on this proposal. SDC provides little information on valuation other than the public being able to get the rating values which are very light compared to the proposed \$7.18m purchase price of the land.

I have tried to make an educated guess of what might have appeared on the A&P valuation that was supplied to the Council and the Stratford Press.

Valuation

The SDC at the meeting talked of a report produced for the A&P, which they have, that has the market land values and also information on the ability of the A&P to repay the loan.

The A&P were asked if that could be made available to submitters, but Mr McDonald from the A&P said it would have to be put to his committee first. There was going to be another report to be presented after the submission closure date giving further info on future potential funding sources and governance structure. All too late for this decision process. This all smacks of putting the cart before the horse.

Had this information been made available it may have made the A&P case to borrow and repay more viable but to me seems like something is being hidden from the ratepayers.

Interestingly the Stratford Press in its article on feedback sought on plan to loan \$7.18m on page 3 of its Wednesday October 14 2020 edition quotes, "This risk would be mitigated by council holding security over the two properties being purchased as well as the property the A&P Association already owns. The three properties together have a land value of \$6,950,000 according to a 2020 valuation the Association had requested".

If I assume this is the same valuation that was given to Council, I then did some interpolation so I could come up with a possible CV from said valuation. My assessment from the Stratford Press information, depending on which assumptions I use is in the order of \$5.5m to \$6.2m.

Unfortunately, without being able to see the actual valuation report provided by the A&P it is difficult to determine the value given by the report my very rough analysis would seem to show that the property may be being purchased at too high a price. I am also aware that the property in question is in quite a rundown state and does not represent the high end of the market.

I see that the SDC has requested an independent valuation. I hope that if the valuation shows that the A&P is potentially paying too much then Council should review its options.

Other Concerns

I am very concerned for the welfare of the A&P which has been hosting one of, if not the single biggest attended annual event in the Stratford District for over 100 years. I would hate to have that lost for the sake of what could be a large white elephant.

Although the prospect of a successful project is commendable, it will take many years of hard work and determined leadership. Plus, much in the way of financial contributions from whom and where?

I find it commendable that A&P are risking everything to further the big project for Stratford and Taranaki but feel that other options were glossed over for what the A&P membership truly wanted was perhaps a larger showground to better support their existing business. I feel they should not carry this burden alone for what is being touted as potentially a great asset for the whole of Stratford District.

Personally, I am of the view that A&P should borrow \$7.18m to upgrade the current facilities.

I think it is imperative that Council does not jeopardise any future borrowing potential for the District if it approves the on-lending to the A&P. I would hate to think that if caught short due to a failure in District core infrastructure a loan could not be secured to carry out essential core business.


I am 'born and raised' in Taranaki, am an equestrian enthusiast, and have represented New Zealand competing in Showjumping competitions. I am a member of the Stratford A&P Steering Committee for this project, and the multi-generational approach being adopted for the project has the potential to bring a world-class facility to the region. A single-use equestrian indoor training and competition arena is a key component of this proposed development, and would result in significant benefits for the strong equestrian community within the Taranaki region. It is a facility that our equestrian community currently lack in the Taranaki, and one that would be well utilised for regional competition, national competition, and training purposes (particularly in the winter months).

I initially had my doubts for the equestrian component of this development, given the quality outdoor equestrian venue we have with the Egmont A&P showgrounds in Hawera. However, in consideration of the project vision (particularly the inclusion of a single-use, world-class indoor arena), the central location of Stratford within the region, and the multi-generational approach to this project, I am strongly in support of this project.

The creation of an 'Equestrian hub' within the Stratford Park also has the potential to attract equestrian competitors and trainers to relocate to work/train in the Stratford area. It will also likely create commercial benefits for Stratford, as equestrian related business activities (i.e. veterinary clinics, feed stores etc.) are proposed to be a significant part of the development. This commercial attraction will aid in facilitating loan repayments, which appear likely as part of the preferred land purchasing Option (Option 4).

Our show season is currently from early November to the end of March. These are getting to be some of the hottest months for showing, and the availability of an indoor venue is becoming more and more a requirement for the safe showing of our animals.

We currently make extensive use of the indoor arena in Hawera to hold our events, but this location is becoming harder to book as it is being used for other events, from paint ball competitions to indoor moto-x riding.

The development of an additional Equestrian park in the district would give us additional options when planning our events.

Stratford is a central location for such a facility.

We support option 4 of the proposal, this we feel gives the A&P Association the funds needed to progress the development of the facility while minimising the risk to the Stratford rates base. We understand that this is not a decision to be made lightly but we feel that such a development dedicated to equine usage would be well supported and know of 2 national miniature horse bodies that would make use of the facility for their national events. We would also support such an venue as its central location would reduce travel for our local competitors.

This is the first time in many, many years that an all equestrian facility in Taranaki has been proposed, it is very exciting for our sport in general.

TEJ currently has approximately 95 members, we are an Area Group affiliated to Equestrian Sports New Zealand. Our mission is to advance jumping and show hunter in the Taranaki Region by providing a welcoming club environment, training opportunities and running local and national shows. We also endeavour to encourage and promote the advancement of volunteers, officials and course designers.

Every January TEJ runs a national event which attracts over 450 horses and approximately 170 riders, along with numerous supporters, volunteers and officials. There is no reason that the Stratford A&P couldn't also attract these same numbers if they had the land and facilities to host a ESNZ carded event. With town being so close there is no doubt that the many visitors would head out into local shops and restaurants.

The idea of the Stratford Park being so centrally located within Taranaki is very appealing. In particular TEJ would greatly benefit from a purpose-built indoor arena, particularly for our winter training. To Whom It May Concern

Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the Stratford A & P Association's proposal for the development of Stratford Park. Sport Taranaki is impressed by the leadership and enthusiasm that the A & P Association has shown with respect to this project, we commend them on the collaborative approach they have undertaken to get this far. Equally Stratford District Council are always looking for innovative ways for Stratford to punch above its weight and this ambitious project is no exception.

Sport Taranaki has been aware of the Stratford Park project since it was submitted to the Regional Sport & Recreation Facilities Steering Group in June 2019, at this time the A & P Association were seeking support to undertake the Feasibility Study. Sport Taranaki is tasked with the implementation of the Regional Strategic Approach to Sport & Recreation Facilities on behalf of this Steering Group. The Steering Group is made up of representatives of the three District Councils, community funders, Sport New Zealand, Venture Taranaki, and Sport Taranaki. The Strategic Approach is a regional response to funders wanting to be more strategic with their investment, a network of aging facilities that are no longer fit-for-purpose, gaps and duplication in provision, and facilities we cannot afford to operate. Thus, Sport Taranaki works alongside sport and recreation codes, funders, and Councils to ensure that new facilities:

- meet an identified need (including the appropriate scale of solution)
- are future proof
- are accessible
- are sustainable
- involve partnering and collaboration
- are integrated/multi-use and fit-for-purpose

Many of these principles guide our feedback on the Stratford Park Proposal.

IDENTIFIED NEED

The needs of Speedway and to some extent the A & P Association with respect to securing their future (including protection from the residential area) and upgrading facilities that are aged, no longer safe, or fit-for-purpose are pretty clear along with the potential benefits of a regional home for motorsport. However, the evidence for need for equestrian users are less apparent.

Sport Taranaki are currently working with the Taranaki Equestrian Network to develop a Regional Network Plan for Equestrian Facilities across Taranaki. This Plan is in line with the priorities of the Strategic Approach and will acknowledge the hierarchy of facilities that exists (local, regional, and national) while identifying the needs and priorities for the region. It will be vital that in doing this we also work with the various equestrian clubs to develop regional leadership for equestrian sport, to lead and advocate for the implementation of this Plan with funders and Councils. Sport Taranaki understands that some improvements are needed to the existing Egmont Showgrounds facility to ensure it is accessible and fit-for-purpose for equestrian users, as this is recognized as the regional home for equestrian. The data from the Stratford Park Feasibility Study shows the potential impact of the proposed equestrian facilities at Stratford Park on existing venues like Egmont Showgrounds would be significant.

The Feasibility Study also clearly shows that the majority (69%) of horses are located in the New Plymouth District, this also supports the equestrian priorities in the Strategic Approach which include developing a network of facilities (from trails to arenas) in North Taranaki to better accommodate the needs of the majority of riders. In light of this, Sport Taranaki cannot support the development of further equestrian facilities until the future of horse racing in Taranaki is better understood and the Regional Network Plan for Equestrian Facilities is complete.

INTEGRATED/MULTI-USE FACILITIES

Sport Taranaki supports the concept in creating a 'hub' of community, event, and sporting facilities at Flint Road. However, we are not convinced that the current Master Plan realises all of the potential benefits associated with 'hubbing' especially given current utilization rates (see Appendix A); and as such we are committed to working alongside Stratford District Council, Stratford A & P Association, and other key stakeholders to further refine the Master Plan to ensure:

- duplication of facilities is minimized (e.g. opportunities to share parking, grandstands, arenas, bathrooms, social/indoor spaces, storage, grazing/greenspace areas, ticketing) and efficiencies are maximised
- the scale of facility is appropriate to the current and future needs thus maximising utilization and sustainability of the facility
- a greater ability for facilities to be flexible and shared across user groups (the current Master Plan affords each user group its own specialised area) to decrease capital and operational costs (including consideration of whole of life costs and affordable user rates)

In summary, Sport Taranaki endorses **Option 4** with the following prefaces:

- i. that there are no implications for ratepayers
- ii. that there are no negative impacts on future borrowing for the Council
- iii. that the business case for continuing to operate the land as a farm will service the loan and associated fees, so not to create an undue hardship or risk for either parties.


We know that time and resources spent in the planning phase of these large-scale projects pays dividends in the long-run and as such we urge you to not build it and expect 'they will come'. We have enough facilities in the region that have adopted this ethos and have become a burden for Councils when they never came. If this project is a priority for the district we feel that while assisting with the financing of the additional land is beneficial, Stratford District Council could further support this project by providing:

- funding and planning support for the development of a sound business case
- provide input into refining the Master Plan and developing the detailed design (especially in terms of functional, cost-effective facility management), as well as the governance and management models for the facility
- investigating what protective measures are available using the Resource Management Act to further protect Speedway from future urban sprawl.

Neil McDonald in particular has done an incredible job of harnessing this vision and bringing people with him on the journey, but in order for it to become a reality he needs skilled expertise to support the next phase of planning. As mentioned previously Sport Taranaki is happy to assist in whatever capacity is deemed appropriate to secure the best possible outcome for Stratford and the region.

APPENDIX A: Current Facility Utilisation Summary

The Stratford Park Phase 1 Feasibility Study identifies the following current facility users, Sport Taranaki have summarized these to better understand utilisation rates as follows:

Horse Racing - Racecourse

- 60 race horses trained year round
- 2 horse racing events (harness & trotting)

Motor Sport - Speedway

- 20 speedway events per annum with an average of 120 cars and 1850 spectators per event

Equestrian - Showgrounds

- 61 equestrian events per annum (training days, shows & competitions) with an average of 25 riders (minimum 6, maximum 80) and an average of 38 spectators per event (minimum 9, maximum 120 this includes regular Pony Club Rallies and All Breeds Training over summer); numbers for multi-day events have been multiplied by the number of days the event covers

A & P Association - Showgrounds

- 1 A & P show per annum with an average of 12,000 visitors
- 10 calf sales per annum
- 1 circus per annum
- community hire of indoor hall
- freedom camping
- horse measuring

Sport Taranaki have grouped the usage by event size and estimated the areas they use as follows (this excludes the horse racing events):

Significant Events (1000+ people)

- 20 Speedway event per annum (speedway, grandstand, ticketing, parking, toilets, social/indoor facilities, storage, food & beverage)
- 1 A & P Show (arena, grazing/greenspace area, grandstand, storage, parking, ticketing, toilets, social/indoor facilities, food & beverage)
- 1 Circus (grazing/greenspace area, parking, ticketing, toilets, social/indoor facilities, food & beverage)

Medium Events (70 - 200 people)

- 10 Calf Sales (arena, grandstand, bathrooms, parking)
- 20 Equestrian Training or Events (arena, bathrooms, storage, grandstand, ticketing, parking, food & beverage)

Minor Events (<70 people)

- 41 Equestrian Training or Events (arena, bathrooms, storage, grandstand, ticketing)
- Community Hall Bookings (hall, bathrooms)
- Horse Measuring (arena, parking, storage)
- Freedom Camping (grazing/greenspace, bathrooms, outdoor power)

*It is assumed that Significant Events will need the entire facility to operate however such events account for less than one event per fortnight based on current utilization; thus, more events could be accommodated with little to no effect on all current events

*The Minor to Medium Events account for between 70 – 100 days of use, less than 2 days of use per week for part of the facility; this can comfortably be accommodated around existing Significant Events

Thus, with good design and management of the facility, different user groups could share the same facilities with plenty of available time to attract new events.




